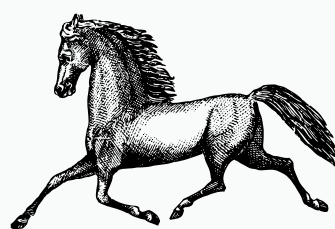

Equestrian Center

The Equestrian School is an accredited British Horse Society training and examination school, and our fully-qualified coaches teach specialist horse riding programs, including trail riding and cross country riding.

The equestrian centre has two indoor schooling arenas with air conditioning, an outdoor arena, a cross-country course and ample land and trails for hacking out.

Accommodation

Gleneagles is an AA Five Red Star golf resort hotel set in 850 acres of stunning scenery. The resort celebrated its 90th anniversary in June 2014 and was when it was opened on 7 June 1924 it was described as 'a Riviera in the Highlands' and 'the eighth wonder of the world'.

Golf

Golf at Gleneagles is an unashamed pleasure. In March 1999, Gleneagles reintroduced Visitor Golf to make the three championship standard courses available to a wider audience. Playing over the immaculate greens and fairways provides unrivalled views of some of the most spectacular scenery in the world. The courses were the inspiration of two of the world's most famous golfers, James Braid, five times winner of The Open, who designed the King's and Queen's, and Jack Nicklaus, Golfer of the Century, who created the PGA Centenary Course (formerly named the Monarch's).

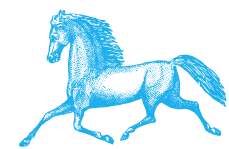
The courses include the famous 18-hole Centenary Course designed by Jack Nicklaus and the King's, Queen's and 9-hole Wee course. Starting times are pre-booked. Tee times can also be arranged at nearby St. Andrew's.

The Jackie Stewart Shooting School

provides a wide range of clay target sporting disciplines, individual practice and instruction. Guns and cartridges are provided. Reservations are pre-booked.

Fishing

Salmon fishing is available on the hotel's own private beats on the river Tay. Trout fishing is also available on three lochs on the Gleneagles estate.

British School of Falconry

The school, situated on the estate, houses a variety of Peregrine Falcons, Brown Eagles and Harris Hawks with which guests of all ages have the opportunity to handle and experience flying these noble birds.

The Gundog School

New within the last year, the gundog school gives guests of all ages the chance to practice with and then experience the techniques of working with a gundog.

Off Road Driving

Try your hand at a true off road experience in one of the Land Rovers. Both adult course available as well as Junior Off Road for children ages 3-9.

Archery

Getting THERE

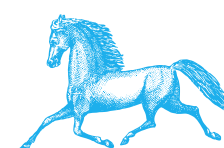


By Air: Scotland has two major international airports: Edinburgh (44 miles) and Glasgow (48 miles). Arrangements can be made for transfers. Taxi (1-3 people and luggage) from Glasgow and Edinburgh is about £130 each way. Pick up sign will read: Gleneagles and will also have your surname.

Gleneagles is within an hour's drive from Edinburgh and Glasgow, great centres of history with museums, galleries and opera houses.

Airport Transfers: Airport transfers can be arranged as follows (1-4 people):
Glasgow Airport or City Centre: £140 per car
Edinburgh Airport or City Center: £140 per car

By Rail: From London King's Cross station it takes six hours to transfer directly into Gleneagles Station. Brit Rail (800) 462-2748
